

Location: The museum is situated in the village of Tuxford one minute off the A1 in North Nottinghamshire. It is housed in an old coaching inn, The Newcastle Arms, the large white building on the corner of the main road and Newcastle Street.

Parking: is easy. It has its own large car park behind the museum accessed off Newcastle Street.

Catering: There is a coffee shop on the premises serving light lunches and home made cakes.

Disabled Access: There are disabled facilities downstairs in the art gallery but sadly until we can raise funds we have no disabled access to the museum. However all items can be seen on a screen downstairs.




